# Pray for Julie and Andrew Friend in Lombok

Merry Christmas! We hope you are well. Thank you so much for your prayers and support. This month we decided we might start to share our friends' stories, so that you may pray from them.

Our Friend Siok- The other day we were praying about who should be our househelper and we heard God say to both of our hearts, "Siok, 3 days a week." Siok's father, Amin (Amen) grew up in the village where we now live. He has a lot of insight into his own culture and thinks about things, which has led to interesting talks about Jesus. His words to us were, "It's OK for you to believe in Jesus, but I can't (meaning because he is a Muslim)." His first wife died and left him with a son, who works as a cleaner at my (Julie's) school. Then he married Sari, a woman whose first husband left her alone with a daughter named Nung. Nung married Andrew's best friend, Sis. Amin and Sari have 3 children together. The youngest was a student of mine and is a local surfer. It's amazing how God has intertwined our lives! Siok is their second daughter and has shown similar depth of insight as her father. Over the past month we have had many conversations about life, relationships and the word. She now has a copy of the Torah, but even more exciting is that I prayed for her the other day as she was feverish and aching. When I left she vomited; and then went to sleep and was better. Her mum (Sari) was there when I prayed and told Siok that she was healed because of my prayer! From this I was able to share that it is Jesus who heals, not us. We believe that Siok and her family are key for reaching this area and beyond. Pray for this family that they will see the Gospel clearly and believe boldly and without fear.

**EAST LOMBOK** / **DRIP IRRIGATION:** I (Andrew) have started working with a non-profit organization here that is involved in community development. I'm working in their Agricultural division coming up with ways to help poor farmers struggling with dry soil on the east part of the island. It's been great to be involved and start to network resources and talk to the people in these villages. Please lift up our friends Rio and Rina as they work and live with the local community on the east coast.

**TURKEY?** I (Andrew) was looking at the brochure for a prayer conference for Muslims in Turkey and immediately felt deep in my heart that God wanted me to go to that conference. I thought, "That's crazy!" Then, deciding to investigate a little bit more, I checked the dates and was shocked to see that it was exactly the time of our scheduled visa run. Coincidence? We don't think so, but we are praying to see what God wants us to do with this opportunity as it is expensive. Please pray with us.

**ISAAC'S UPDATE:** I'm nearly 4 months old now. This place is hot but I love A/C and bath time. Please pray that my tummy gets stronger so that I don't throw up all the time. I also want to become an American citizen, so I have to go to the consulate in Bali.
