

Pray for Alfred and Alsie Ng in China

- Pray that God will continue to open doors despite the new local government in DuAn now requiring all activities involving schools be approved by both the Department of Education and the HeChi City Government. Praise for the swift approval of the 2013 English Camp in early January which has given the organisers plenty of time to plan the activities.
- Pray that the planning of the upcoming Sydney and Melbourne information sessions for the China English Camp will go smoothly. Pray that many people will be moved to apply for this short-term team and that their lives will be transformed as a result.
- Praise for sufficient funding to provide 70 poor Korean families in Yanbian with 50kg of rice each at Christmas. Praise that 18 families were provided with 1 tonne of coal each for heating during the severe winter months. Pray for God's protection over those who are most vulnerable in these conditions, especially the poor and elderly.
- Praise for the \$15,800 donated by WorldShare's supporters after the Yiliang Church in Yunnan was destroyed by an earthquake last September. Praise that the church members can now begin to rebuild the church so they no longer have to meet for Sunday worship under a temporary canvas shelter.
