Pray for Christians in North Korea

Persecution of Christians in North Korea shows no sign of abating under the country's new leader, Kim Jong-Un, according to a report by the worldwide ministry *Open Doors*. "Of an estimated 200,000 prisoners in North Korea, 70,000 of them are Christians." "Many North Koreans attempt to escape to neighbouring China, and an informal network of Christians seek to provide practical assistance when they cross the border. Police officials follow the refugees over the border and hunt down and vigorously prosecute those who convert to Christianity while in China or those who attempt to bring Christian literature back to North Korea." "North Koreans who visit China are interrogated when they return about whether they met any Christians and whether they visited a church there". The US State Department has said that, even though there are four state-controlled Christian churches in Pyongyang, "foreigners who visited the country stated that church services appeared staged and, in addition to religious themes, contained political content supportive of the government,".
