## Pray for the work of Open Doors in the Middle East

**Syria:** According to the UNHCR, there are currently 1,608,706 Syrian Refugees needing aid. There are nearly 500,000 Syrian refugees in Lebanon and Jordan, and an average of 8,000 Syrians crossing the border each day seeking refuge in neighbouring countries. An estimated 80,000 Syrians have been killed since 2011. The situation in Syria, and of those forced to leave the country, is desperate and becoming more so each day. These refugee families have no homes, income or even the most basic necessities for living.

**Irag:** Christians in Irag are on the verge of extinction. Large numbers have fled abroad or to the (until recently) safer Kurdish region, where they face unemployment and inadequate schooling, medical care and housing. The church faces many challenges - members being killed or abducted, and a lack of capable leaders. In central and southern Iraq, traditional Christians suffer as much as Muslim-background believers, as a result of their visibility.

Egypt: The 2011 revolution that ousted President Mubarak initially brought Muslims and Christians together, but improved relations were short-lived. The Muslim Brotherhood won parliamentary elections in November 2011 and a new Islamist-backed constitution was signed into law in December 2012. However, because this government could not bring necessary law and order, a new revolution has ousted the Muslim Brotherhood from power, leaving the military in control once again. Although persecution of Christians is on the rise and massive emigration of Christians is a concern, still the church continues to grow.
