Pray for Alfred and Alsie's work in China

A & A Ministries has work in three parts of China:

<u>Yanbian Prefecture in the province of JiLin</u> in northeast China is often referred to as the "Third Korea" because of the 850,000 Korean Chinese living there. Most of them are North Korean descendants. Yanbian is strategically positioned as the gateway to North Korea and Russia, so there are great opportunities to reach out to both countries through the Korean Chinese in Yanbian. Our *Sponsor- A- Child* program supports poor families in urban and rural areas. Many of the children involved with the sponsorship program in Yanbian have only one parent or have been abandoned by their parents and are cared for by a grandparent. Some of the children have family members who have been affected by leprosy. A leprosy clinic has been established by our partner.

<u>Yunnan province</u> is one of the most beautiful regions in China, with terrain ranging from tropical rainforests in the east to the icy Tibetan mountains on Yunnan's western border. It is home to one-third of China's minority groups. Our partners in Yunnan demonstrate God's love to the villagers in a number of ways, such as building medical clinics, training church workers, planting new churches, youth programs, vocational training for disabled people, microenterprise development, and building water reservoirs. Training programs are welcomed by the churches and even by the local authorities, because they know that solid biblical training has consistently led to good citizenship and orderly church communities.

In <u>Guanxi province</u>, our partners work mainly with the Yao and Zhuang minority groups. The Yaos are predominantly mountain-dweller farmers with an average income of less than \$90 per year. The Zhuangs live mainly in the cities. We partner in this area to help alleviate poverty and hardship due to harsh environmental conditions. We help local pastors and churches to bring the light of Christ into communities of unreached people groups. With 320 million Chinese under the age of 18, we are keen to support youth work. We conduct English camps and English teaching each year, which help the students to improve their English and obtain better grades for entry to higher institutions. Other programs include training pastors, building churches, sending pastors to remote areas, running a Christian book café, medical clinics, building schools, micro-enterprise development and vocational training.
