



In recent news: The Prime Minister, Tony Abbott, has announced the appointment of Mr Andrew Forrest to run a review into the government's Indigenous Affairs Ministry. Mr Forrest said the review would throw open the books of government funding and provide recommendations to ensure indigenous training and employment services are run to connect unemployed indigenous people with real and sustainable jobs. It will also consider ways that training and employment services can better link to the commitment of employers and end the cycle of indigenous disadvantage.

Mr Abbott said the review delivered on an election commitment and showed his government was committed to boosting job opportunities for indigenous Australians. Mr Abbott has promised to spend a week every year in an indigenous community as Prime Minister.
