

# **Pray for St. George Hospital Chaplains**

Thank you for your interest in the chaplaincy ministry at St George Hospital.

#### In the wards

Most of our chaplaincy visiting in the hospital is on a ward basis. That is, we offer a friendly visit to all the patients in their ward. We have a great opportunity to offer pastoral care in Jesus' name!

#### **Precious connections**

Here are a couple of the people that I've met in my visits in the hospital. (I've changed a couple of their personal details so as to protect their privacy.) Prudence is an elderly Christian woman whom I meet every so often in the hospital when some health problem interrupts her life in a nursing home. She would love to be actively involved in Christian service, but is very frustrated by her physical frailty and the lack of Christian fellowship in the nursing home. She is always immensely grateful for conversation and prayer with a fellow-Christian when we meet in the hospital.

Victor spent much of 2013 in hospital, following major cancer surgery, and with many setbacks in his recovery. In our many conversations he shared about his unhappy experience of a 'religious' education, and his vague faith in "Someone out there". A couple of days before he left hospital, he asked me what I believe about the afterlife, so I had the opportunity to speak to him about Christian hope, based on the resurrection of Jesus. He added that he would like to start reading the Bible when he got home.

#### **Christmas opportunities**

This year we've had three special opportunities for Christmas ministry in the hospital. Our evening of Carol singing in the wards (with musicians from the Salvation Army band) was well received. We've also hosted Christmas morning teas in a couple of the hospital wards: the Mental Health Unit and the rehabilitation ward.

#### **Prayer matters:**

Pray for opportunities to offer comfort, forgiveness and hope in the name of Jesus as chaplains visit in the hospital wards. Pray also for continuing good relationships with the hospital management and my role as coordinator of the chaplains' team. Pray for God's provision for the financial needs of the chaplaincy ministry.
