

Pray for Rahel Landrum's visit

Rahel was born in Romania and at the age of twelve moved with her family to Israel. At the age of sixteen, Rahel started attending a Messianic congregation with her parents. Although her mother soon became a believer in Jesus, her Jewish father only became a believer six months before passing away.

It was not until after her father's profession of faith that Rahel became forthright about Jesus. She decided to take a short Bible course because, as she says, "I wanted to see if it was possible to have a relationship with God outside of Y'shua, (Jesus). Believing in him doesn't make you very popular in Israel". It was through that study she became convinced that Jesus' claim to be "the only way to the Father" is true.

Though she already had a BA in English from Haifa University and was working as a teacher, her desire to learn more about the Scriptures led her to study at Capenwray a Bible College in England. After receiving her certificate she returned to Israel and took a teaching job at the first Messianic school in Israel. Yet she also felt a calling to tell other Jewish people about the gospel.

Rahel learned about Jews for Jesus through a friend and participated in the organization's 1990 and 1991 Summer Witnessing Campaigns in New York City. It was there that she met her husband to be Mark Landrum, one of the Jews for Jesus evangelists. The two were wed in March of '92, and Rahel came on staff soon after. She and Mark were missionaries in Chicago for several years, spending their summers in Pasadena where they graduated from the Fuller School of World Missions with Master's degrees in Missiology with emphasis on Jewish studies.

Rahel's sermon next week is entitled, "Jesus in the Old Testament. Bring your friends to hear her faith-filled testimony of life in Christ.
