

Moving to the Village — On New Year's Day, we signed a 3-year rental contract on a house in the village of Selong Blanak that has lots of potential. It is located in what would be termed a traditional village, meaning everyone lives very close together (*no privacy*) and does everything together according to traditional practices including consulting the witch doctor for consultations. We plan to move around the end of this year (following a trip to the USA from the end of May until middle of July).

Siok and Agus — So far, Siok and I have studied all the stories from the Old Testament and 3 stories from the Gospels. She is tracking really well and beginning to understand why we need a Saviour. When we discussed the story about Jesus calming the storm, she said that He was more like an angel or God. I don't think she really understands what she said yet, but I was encouraged. Please pray that she continues to get revelation and for a way for her to share with her family.

Agus is growing more and more in his knowledge and delight of Jesus. He especially enjoys the connection through prayer. We have been talking with him more about "being dunked" in water. Please pray that he would lead his whole family to take this step of commitment. Please also pray for his family that they would be healthy.

God at work — It's been amazing to see God working in the lives of our friends. In the last few weeks, I (*Andrew*) have felt that God has been giving us a clearer picture of how He is working here. We feel that, as we share and disciple people, we are figuratively planting seedlings of trees which will become "oaks of righteousness". To see transformation it will take 1 to 2 generations, just like it takes time for a tree to grow to maturity.
