

The Voice of the Martyrs invites you to take part in a new ministry campaign. Sign a letter to the "supreme" leader of North Korea and let him know our commitment to stand with our brothers and sisters who are suffering persecution.

Now is the time to make our confession to Kim Jong Un. We declare that we will remain loyal to the one true God and continue to stand with our persecuted family members in North Korea. We know what is happening in North Korea. We commit to telling the world about the crimes of its leader and to do everything in our power to assist our persecuted family there.

We invite you to add your voice in support of North Korean Christians by digitally signing the Letter of Confession. We will deliver these letters to North Korea's representatives to the United Nations.
