Missionary work can get quite complicated in Muslim countries. Because it is illegal to be a 'missionary' in Indonesia, Andrew and Julie work with a Non-Government Organisation (NGO) called The One Heart Foundation, under a social visa. Their main work involves education and agricultural community development. The One Heart Foundation is a non-profit agency that serves the people of West Nusa Tenggara through its programs that focus on community health, agriculture (especially in the arid regions of the island), literacy and culture. Its Mission and Vision are as follows:

<u>VISION</u>: Lifting the socio-economic status of West Nusa Tenggara province to the average enjoyed by other provinces of Indonesia.

MISSION: Supporting the efforts of both governmental and NGO agencies by:

- 1. Eliminating poverty on Lombok island
- 2. Ensuring that every rural household has access to clean water and proper sanitation
- 3. Eliminating illiteracy throughout the island of Lombok
- 4. Helping farmers in arid regions of Lombok island through drip irrigation technology
- 5. Providing preventative health education in rural areas
- 6. Eliminating malnutrition

In order to achieve the above stated Vision and Mission through the programs YSA undertakes each year, YSA works together with its Canadian partner agency: Global Development Association.

Andrew and Julie also have an Australian connection through an organisation called Christian Surfers which involves the ministry with youth.

<u>Prayer points</u>: Please pray for Julie as she nears the day of delivering her baby. The c/section is planned for October 6. Julie is losing weight but baby seems to be ok. She is exhausted and struggling with sleep. As you may know Julie also has Gestational diabetes and this does have its problems. Pray for rest, energy and healthy Mum and bub.
