Pray for the David Lakos at St. George Hospital

Thank you for your interest in the chaplaincy ministry at St George Hospital. This occasional newsletter aims to keep you informed and give you points for prayer.

Chaplains' retreat: t the end of October 20 members of our St George team shared in an overnight retreat at the Wollongong Surf Leisure Resort. It was a great time of learning, growing as a team, and also spiritual refreshment. (The photo shows some of us preparing to set off for a walk along Towradgi Beach during our free time.)

Pastoral Care Week: In the last newsletter I mentioned that we had the opportunity in "Pastoral Care Week" (in October) to have an information stall in the hospital foyer. It turned out to be a good time of connecting with staff and visitors, offering them some tasty treats, and letting them know about the work of the chaplains' team.

Plans for training in 2015: We've had a lot of enquiries about our planned training course for next year. We're close to finalising our arrangements for holding an introductory pastoral care course in April, with the hope of having some new volunteers join our team.

Face-to-face: Here are the stories of a couple of the people that I've met in my visits in the hospital. (I've changed some of their personal details so as to protect their privacy.)

* Brian is a Christian man who for many years has been living with depression and anxiety. I've met him and his wife several times in the Older Persons' Mental Health Unit. It's a privilege to offer ministry both to him in his agitation and anxiety, and also to his wife, who experiences sadness and frustration in her life with a partner with long-term mental illness.

* Alison has had several long stays in the hospital over the last three years. Most recently she was told that her life expectancy was only a matter of months. We had many long conversations about faith, and she asked many questions, though she always seemed to be much better at talking than listening! At this stage I don't know how things ended up for her; all I could do was to urge her to seek God, to ask him to reveal himself to her, and to check out for herself the evidence for Jesus in the gospels.
