

# Pray for Alfred and Alsie NG

Last November, a WorldShare medical team visited Guangxi and Jilin provinces in China to assist the work of our local ministry partners, Alfred and Alsie Ng.

The team of 11 spent the first week in DuAn County, Guangxi (southcentral China) where WorldShare has been working with our ministry partners Alfred and Alsie Ng and the local government since 2002. We had a wonderful week of running medical and dental clinics in villages high in the mountains of this rural and largely oppressed area. The clinics were well attended and appreciated by the local people and pastors, with team members contributing in their various roles – doctor, nurse, dentists, sterilising equipment, managing the waiting crowds, a children's program – everyone had an important role to play. In addition, one team member ran training sessions for local pastors.

In the second week, we visited Yanji in far north-east China, near the North Korean and Russian borders. Pastor Lydia heads up the ministry to the poor Korean community, many of whom are descendants of North Korean refugees. WorldShare assists with a Sponsor a Child (SAC) program which helps 160 students and their families. The SAC support from Australians makes a huge contribution to the family as a whole. It is hum-





bling and a blessing to be a part of this program and to see the benefit it brings. A number of families were visited with the delivery of coal and rice to help them survive the harsh winter in this area.

The team ended in Beijing where a number of the team took the opportunity to visit the Great Wall, Forbidden City, Summer Palace and other amazing sites. It was truly a privilege to be a part of a wonderful team, working alongside our partners.
