

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past month I was being reminded on how sovereign God is in our evangelism on campus. A quote from J.I. Packer in his book, Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God, says 'The prayer of a Christian is not an attempt to force God's hand, but a humble acknowledgement of helpless dependence...what we do every time we pray is to confess our own impotence and God's sovereignty'. I realize that I need to repent that in my prayer for non-believers God brought to our group, I often rely on my strength rather than confessing my dependency on God and acknowledge His sovereignty.

And he did show how sovereign he is during FOCUS camp, early this month. When I was in UTS, I got to know a non-Christian, Ricky, from China. He started coming to FOCUS two years ago. I was serving in the kitchen leading four members of our church, labouring from 6am until 8pm, everyday during the camp. Praise God who gave us the strength to endure!

The Indonesian post graduate and family group has been meeting throughout the holidays and last Saturday we studied the parable of the prodigal son from Luke's gospel.
