## Give Thanks for Synod 2015

Bart and I have just been to Synod. Synod is the regular annual gathering of all the Anglican churches in the Sydney Diocese. The work of Synod is law-making putting together all the structures that keep us safe and well-governed, but the fun of Synod is getting a window into a bigger picture of Anglicans in Sydney and the wider world.

So, my personal highlights from Synod 2015 were:

- the opening service in St Andrew's Cathedral glorious singing from a boy choir, and a most rousing rendition of When The Saints Go Marching In, with every trumpet and drum and loud instrument at their disposal it felt to me like there should have been dancing in the aisles, but being good Anglicans, they all stood still and sang quietly along.
- learning that we, and every other Anglican church in Sydney Diocese, pay 2% levy on all our income! That money goes to buy land in new and developing areas, so churches can be built. We saw two churches that have been established on land bought with that money Oran Park and Glenmore Park and saw plans to buy more blocks across Sydney. What a wonderful thing, to see the long-term planning, and the results of previous long-term thinking, and to know our money is contributing.
- hearing a report on the Church of England in England, from whence we as Anglicans originally came, showing how that church has diminished in numbers and strength, being largely liberal and drifting far from the Bible and God. He also told us about a missionary endeavour back to that church, and how many churches are finding new life and vitality as they return to the Bible and life in Christ.
- discovering how, in 2008, Bishop, Peter Tasker had a casual conversation with a bishop from Mauritius about their need for Bible training. One minister could be responsible for 10 - 12 churches, with untrained helpers and little training himself. Peter brought Moore College's famous PTC theological training course to Mauritius, and now many ministers and helpers have received the training and are better equipped to minister in their churches.
- watching Archbishop Glenn Davies exhort Sydney Anglicans to welcome the Syrian refugees that our government will be bringing here from early next year. Many people spoke of what they are already doing to prepare, and gave many good suggestions how to welcome and support these refugees. Merilyn Mayhew
