

Pray for Andrew and Julie Friend in Lombok

Asniatun and the horror of poverty: At the end of last year my heart broke as we walked with our helper (Jamiah) and her sick daughter. Asniatun began feeling sick on Saturday and after I (Julie) visited her on Tuesday I suspected appendicitis and told her mother we needed to take her to hospital immediately. The girl's grandmother insisted she go to the witch doctor instead. The following Sunday they finally agreed to take her to hospital. It was too late. Her appendix had ruptured and 4 days post-surgery, 14yr old Asniatun died. I have really grieved for this little girl. I thought I would have more time to share about Jesus with her. It's hard to let go. Thank the Father that as I took her body home, her community wasn't angry but thanked me for showing love. Please pray for Jamiah. Pray also for me as I struggle through disappointment and long to see the miraculous in this place.

Battling Sickness and "Overwhelmedness": After our somewhat disastrous trip to KL with typhoid fever suffering Isaac and teething Enok, we've been exhausted! It seems like everyone has been sick including our house helper, Jamiah. It's brought everything up to where we feel overwhelmed. We continue to try to stay positive although we definitely have moments. Please pray for us!! Thank you for all the words of support that we've had recently. Unfortunately we had to let Jamiah go in March. However, we found a quick replacement named Minah who is doing a good job so far. On her first day cleaning our book shelf she noticed some interesting literature including our local language NT. She got very excited and has borrowed it. Please ask that the Father will open her heart and confirm His word.

Lombok Seeds- starting a new foundation: A bright spot over the last month or 2 has been the development of a possible new foundation (Yayasan) founded and run by Indonesian believers. The Lombok Seeds project will contribute to helping them get started on new community development projects in new communities. We will be giving accountability and direction as well as some finances as we seek to empower these nationals to reach these communities- both physically and spiritually.

Language consultants- a new visa: Our social worker visa has not been able to be renewed. By divine conspiracy, we have been able to join a friend's already established business as a part-time language and cultural consultant for expats coming in with little knowledge of the language and culture. If successful, this will hopefully help to offset visa costs and perhaps other expenses.

Fatherheart: Our colleagues will be running a 'Fatherheart' school here in May and have asked us to translate. We look forward to participating again in May and anticipate beautiful things for our co-workers here.
