

Preaching program


Next Sermon Series: "Decision Making and the Will of God"

Pray for the Friends in Lombok

Developing- It has been very exciting to see the very beginnings of a local fellowship. We have been privileged to meet the young man (local) who is pioneering this effort. He has believed in JC for 10 years and experienced much persecution. Please pray for him (we're calling him "Special K") as he continues to understand more of who he is in JC. Agus has also gone to a meeting and was very excited about it. He always tries to teach me what he has learned. Pray for the protection of this fellowship and that those going will have boldness to share their faith with their friends and families.

Fatherheart- Last month we helped to translate for the Fatherheart school here. Many locals were blessed and encountered our Father's love in a deep way. We were encouraged to hear their testimonies. Please ask Father to continue the good work He has begun. I (Julie) know I still need so much more healing and freedom to learn to live as a daughter without the personal pressure of striving to perform in order to please Him.

Work visa!- We got the visa!! Yes!! Andrew is now working (unpaid J) for his Australian friend doing multiple projects including local-language dictionary, a cultural seminar for expats and will be trained in website-development. We are encouraged to have a long-term visa which takes a lot of pressure off of us. PTL!!

The Future- Over the past few months we have been asking Father whether or not we should continue to live in SB next year. The question has been raised as our landlord would like to move into our house in January. While other houses have been offered they all need extensive renovations (no ceilings, no kitchen, no bathroom etc). Aside from this we have also experienced a fair amount of stress due to illness, lack of sleep, the local spiritual climate and lack of fellowship. Our concerns for Isaac's education and social development also play a part. On the other hand we really love it here and feel like we're just beginning. We have good relationships with our neighbours and much prefer the lifestyle in the village. We have both cried over the possibility of leaving so soon. We intend to make one final offer on the house this month. Please ask Father to give us wisdom and a clear answer.

Papuq- One of our neighbours (Papuq) is an elderly woman who has been married several times to men who have all died before her. She is the mother of many of our neighbours and one of the sweetest women I know. Recently she gave our boys chickens to keep for pets. She only speaks the local dialect for this small region so communication is very difficult but despite this I have had opportunity to pray for her healing a few times and she has felt immediate changed and encouraged me to pray for others. Since sharing that our house contract won't be extended she cried as she said 'Please don't leave us'. Please pray for Papuk that she would have more encounters with Father and share with her children also. Pray for me (Julie) as I share with her and endeavour to speak her language. Ask Father for a way to communicate effectively about who He is.

Enok- Our poor little boy has had so many issues with his breathing. Every time he gets a little cold it goes straight to his lungs. Thank you so much for your prayers, it has really helped to keep him out of hospital. We are asking for a miracle to restore strength to his lungs and his immune system.
