

Pray for Sudan

Another participant at the Anglican Leadership Institute with Bart is a Bishop from **Sudan** named **Bishop Andudu Ilnail**, from the Diocese of Kadugli. He is a remarkable man. But to understand how remarkable he is, you need to understand his difficult situation.

Although the mostly-Christian region of **South Sudan** seceded from Sudan in July 2011, there are still many Christians living in **Sudan**, mainly in the southern area of the Nuba Mountains. The Arab Muslim government desires to control all the petroleum resources in the mountains without any intention of offering help to the (mostly Christian) people of this area. Racism by the Arabs of these black African Christians complicates the situation.

Five years ago, people in this southern area began to rebel against the government. In response, the government of President Omar al-Bashir began an all-out assault against them, resulting in a brutal, grinding conflict in which the rebel's civilian communities are the ultimate victims. In these five years of conflict, thousands of people have been killed and nearly 400,000 have been displaced. Most humanitarian aid has been blocked by the Sudanese government and few journalists are able to access the region.



Here is where **Bishop Andudu** comes into the picture. One year ago, he came to the USA to further his studies. After several months abroad, he heard that many of his churches had been burned down by the government and many of his people were killed. Bishop Andudu raced back to Sudan and was able to slip back into his Diocese to encourage his flock. However, when he returned to the USA (and to his wife and children who had initially come over with him), he heard that he was now on a list of targeted clergy that the Muslim government wanted to silence. Just recently, several of his fellow clergy have been arrested and face trial

for sedition and fomenting rebellion. He has since sought political asylum here in the USA. Although he now has no passport and cannot travel, yet he faithfully uses his base in the USA to continually encourage Sudanese Christians wherever they are, even in Australia. He is a remarkable man.

- Pray for the people of Sudan and the Nuba Mountain region. Pray for an end to the conflict that has killed and displaced so many people, and for food and medical aid to be allowed to reach those who need it. Pray for the clergy who are in prison.
- Pray for the Sudanese government, for an end to targeting civilians in this war and for a willingness to seek a peaceful solution to this conflict.
- Pray for Christians in Sudan, as they face daily persecution and even death because of their faith. Pray for courage, for the comforting presence of the Holy Spirit and for opportunities to meet together to encourage each other without fear.
- Pray for Sudan, for peace, for healing for this troubled nation and for many to hear the Gospel and respond to its truth and the love and grace of Jesus Christ.
