

### Pray for the Anglican Church Worldwide

Every day this past week, Bart has been privileged to sit under the teaching of Bishop Michael Nazir-Ali (pictured). Here is brief resume of his background.

Michael Nazir-Ali was born in Karachi, Pakistan. Although his father had converted from Islam to Christianity, Michael began identifying as a Christian at the age of 15. He studied economics, Islamic history and sociology at the University of Karachi. He went on to study Theology at Cambridge, Oxford, and Harvard. He was ordained as an Anglican priest in Pakistan and later became the first Bishop of West Punjab. When his life was endangered in 1986



for speaking out against the Islamic blasphemy laws, the Archbishop of Canterbury arranged for his refuge in England. He became General Secretary of the Church Mission Society, Later, he was appointed Bishop of Rochester. He was one of the final two candidates for Archbishop of Canterbury. Since 2009, he has been president of Oxford Centre for Training, Research, Advocacy and Dialogue (Oxtrad), building up church leadership in countries where Christians are persecuted such as Iran, Iraq, Pakistan, Syria and Nigeria, as well as working in advocacy and human rights. He recently went to Syria to meet with the President and advocate for the persecuted Church in that nation.

What did he teach us about? Principally, he shared his concerns about the internal collapse of the Anglican Communion as two major factions, one controlled by a liberal agenda and the other seeking to hold firm to the orthodox Biblical faith, wrestle over the leadership of the Anglican Church. In his view, the future of the Anglican Church and her historic mission of Gospel proclamation has been seriously jeopardised by the liberal agenda and risks bringing irreparable damage to the worldwide Communion. (Our brothers and sisters representing the North American and African churches agreed wholeheartedly.)

He also shared his social views. He argues that the decline of Christianity and the rise of secular values in the UK during the 1960s has created a moral vacuum with aggressive secularism and radical Islam filling the gap. He has criticised the British government's social policies as "an agenda which still lacks the underpinning of a moral and spiritual vision", and asked that the government make a public affirmation of the "Christian roots of British society". At the same time, he has become a prominent spokesman for an engagement between Christianity and Islam and has been involved in a number of important dialogues with Muslims.
