



Pray for SRE in Schools

Anne's father, Richard, longed for his family to become Christians. Although Anne had grown up going to church with her father about once a month and seemed to enjoy coming along, she wouldn't say much about it.

But the full impact of Anne's decision was yet to come! Richard continues, "[My wife] Cynthia was born in Malaysia and belongs to a Buddhist family. Most of Anne's uncles and aunts are strongly Buddhist. When Anne told her mum that she really wanted to be baptised, Cynthia surprised me when she decided she would support Anne's decision by regularly going to church with her. Cynthia soon found she wanted to attend church for herself to hear the sermon! Hearing God's Word preached struck a chord ... which led her to be baptised alongside Anne, and Anne's brother, George!"

SRE is helping young people like Anne orient themselves to life in Christ. And even more than that, it is helping to bring the hope and love of Jesus to whole families.

As Richard says, "SRE has had a big impact on our family. I was so happy ... our whole family has now become Christian."
