This term in **Year 7** we are covering the second half of Mark. The gospel is such a clear picture of Jesus- God's promised King, the Son of God whose life and death and resurrection are unique, and for us. Please pray for the girls. Please pray that the lessons may show Jesus to them and that the Holy Spirit would bring life. Please pray for the girls who are enthusiastic, those who are sceptical, those who have never heard of Jesus, those who can't attend but would like to.

The **Year 8s** are starting a unit on Paul's journeys in Acts. This is a terrific unit that brings the girls up close to a life transformed, turned upside down and inside out by the risen Jesus. It also looks at individuals and cities and their different world views and responses to the gospel. Please pray that the girls would be challenged by the different responses to Jesus and compelled by Paul's single minded passion for Jesus and the good news.

How would you answer these questions?

- ♦ (From Year 7) Is it wrong to doubt about Jesus?
- Where would you find this memory verse? "The Son of Man did not come to be a slave master but a slave who will give his life to rescue many people"

[Answers: re. Doubting: There are 2 sorts of doubting- doubting like the disciples (doubting with belief) and doubting like the Pharisees (doubting with unbelief). Jesus deals firmly but kindly with the disciples' struggles and so we should be encouraged. But we need to be careful that we are not proudly sceptical like the Pharisees. re. Memory Verse: Mark 10:45]

Over the last term at lunchtime Christian group at PG we looked at various Psalms, led by Year 9 and 10 girls. They did an excellent job. This term we are hoping to look into some big questions like "What is the most valuable thing that you own?", "How do we know that the Bible is true?"
