Pray for the Persecuted Church in 5 Hotbeds of the World

NORTH KOREA- North Korea, under the brutal rule of the Kim family, is ranked as the most oppressive country in the world for Christians. Christianity is outlawed there and anyone caught worshipping God, praying or reading a smuggled Bible is sent to prison camps. **Pray:** That God would continue to stir up an underground church and protect His church. May God's Kingdom and justice come to North Korea.

SYRIA- Syria is the sixth most oppressive country in the world for a Christian to live. Because Christians tend to live together in geographic pockets and are (perceived) to be pro-government, they are an extremely vulnerable target. **Pray:** For the Christians who are living out their faith at a heavy cost.

SUDAN- Not only is South Sudan experiencing one of the worst famines in history, the country as a whole continues to be one of the most hostile nations to Christianity on the planet. Arrests, attacks and murders plague all the Christian villages in the country, particularly those in the Nuba mountain region. **Pray:** Pray for peace and reconciliation among all people groups in the country, and for aid groups to be free to provide food to those who need it. May God establish just leaders in the country.

IRAQ- There has been a Christian presence in Iraq for nearly two millennia, but it currently sits on the verge of extinction due to the invasion of ISIS in 2014 and the continued oppression by Muslim extremists in the region. **Pray:** Pray first and foremost that in the face of persecution, the Christian church would not just survive, but explode in power, transforming the communities they live in. Secondly, pray for the Islamic extremist groups, that God would miraculously change their hearts.

IRAN- Christianity in Iran is seen as a sign of Western influence. As the government struggles to retain control of its people, it has increased its pressure on Christians. **Pray:** Iran, more than other countries, is teetering on the edge of a change in leadership. Pray that God would bring justice and peace to this nation and would raise up people in Iran committed to religious freedom. Pray for boldness among Christians in Iran who are often treated as second-class citizens and persecuted for sharing their faith.

Ultimately, we know that our fight in this world isn't against corrupt governments or horrifying terrorist groups. There is an Enemy intent on razing this world to the ground, destroying the shalom (fully-realized peace) God intended. All of our prayers then ultimately trace back to the prayer Jesus taught his disciples: Father, May Your Kingdom come and Your will be done. AMEN.
