Pray for the famine in NIGERIA

You've probably heard about the famine sweeping across Nigeria, South Sudan, Somalia and Yemen.

This is the worst humanitarian crisis since World War II and Christians in Nigeria are among those suffering the most. But the famine in Nigeria isn't caused by a natural disaster or drought-it's caused by war.

Northern Nigeria has been torn apart by conflict since 2009, when the Islamic extremist group 'Boko Haram' tried to take over. Churches were destroyed, businesses shut down and many Christians were abducted - including the 276 Chibok girls. Thousands were forced to flee their homes and now live in make-shift camps. Families haven't been able to farm for three years, and now their food reserves have run out.

Many Christians are being excluded from receiving emergency relief, simply because of their faith in Jesus. Outside the camps Christians experience persecution from Islamic extremists. Inside the camps they face daily pressure and isolation. Corruption in Nigeria has meant that a lot of government aid has gone missing and never arrived for those in need. Laraba, a local Christian, told us, "There are some things the government used to bring to help the people, but we Christians don't receive it."

Through our 'Mission Month' fundraising efforts we will be supporting the work of Open Doors in their efforts to give food packs to 15,000 families - that's 75,000 people! Each family will receive a 50kg bag of beans, 100kg of maize, and money for rent, oil and soap.

Even just delivering aid to such a large number of people poses a massive logistical challenge. Controlling crowds of desperate and hungry people is hard, and many have to wait in line for hours. Women faint in the heat and there is the constant threat of another Boko Haram attack. The rainy season also arrived early and forced our local partners to get the food under shelter. But despite the challenges, there is still hope.

> All this is done through the local church, because we believe we are not the answer–Jesus is.
