

Special K - We are excited to be spending more time with a local believer, K, whom we have nicknamed Special K. He has been intentionally focused on reaching his own people for a few years, and he is currently going through a 4 month trial period with us to see if he will work well on our team. He is full of zeal when sharing truth but sometimes lacks discernment and has been discouraged. He also has had a hard upbringing and needs a fair amount of inner healing from God (as we all do). We were blown away the other day when our old friend A (who is a believer) brought his blind friend, R, to our house. We prayed for him for healing, and while he wasn't healed at that moment, he was touched by the love and the power of God to the point of tears. Two weeks later he begged A to come to our house again, heard the message from K, and promptly gave his life to JC. How amazing! We feel privileged to witness God at work.

Norm- Special K is also helping to disciple Norm, the man from an isolated village who has been very hungry for the truth. At this stage, Norm believes most of the significant truths in the Word and will chat with us for hours. However, he has expressed that he feels unready to make a full commitment (as in getting "dunked"). Something is holding him back, but at the same time we believe this could be a good thing as counting the cost of discipleship is so important in a place like this!

Land- We have had our eye on a particular plot in the village where we used to live but it wasn't for sale. A few months ago our friends, (the owners) were in financial need and came to us and asked if we wanted to buy some of their land. So we did! We are very excited to see what Dad will do with this place and thankful for the inheritance He has given us. Please pray that all the legal paperwork will be processed smoothly.

Isaac and Enok- Our boys are growing up so fast. Isaac turned 5 in August and Enok turned 3 this month. Isaac has learned to swim and ride a bicycle in the past few months and is very proud of his new skills. He is doing well at school but we are not happy with the type of education there. Please pray that we will have wisdom about where to send him for Primary school/ Grade school. Enok has had 2 major episodes of breathing difficulties recently. He really needs miraculous healing of his lungs so that we don't have to rush him to the ER every time he gets a cold.
