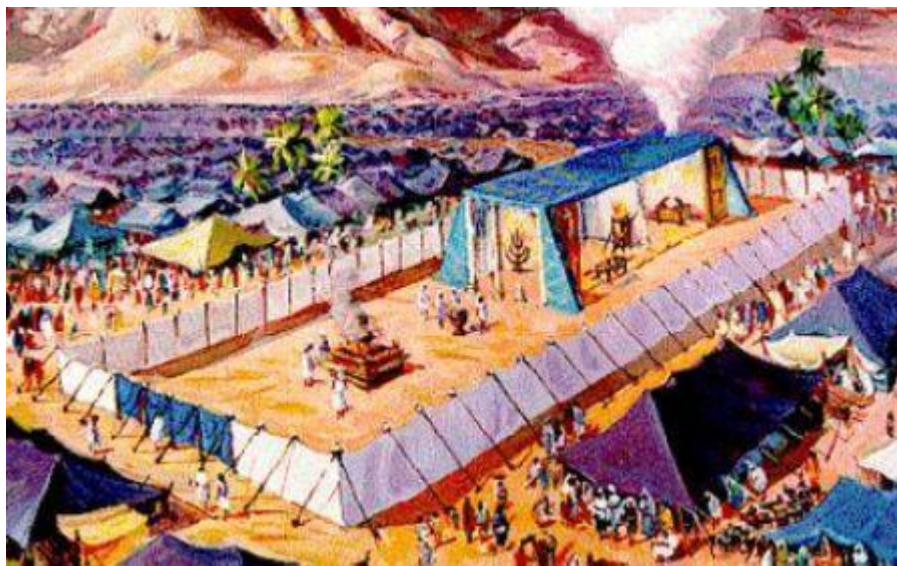

Pray for World Refugee Day

Who are refugees? The 1967 *Refugee Convention* defines a refugee as: “Any person who owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted... is outside the country of his/her nationality and is unable, or owing to such fear, is unwilling to avail himself/herself of the protection of that country.”

Worldwide— Did you know that there are around 44,000 new refugees every day? Worldwide, one in every 110 people is someone who is displaced. In 2017, 68.5 million people were displaced by war, violence and persecution , a new high for the fifth year in a row.

Syria— 4.8 million Syrians are now refugees in surrounding countries, and 13 million are in need of humanitarian aid. Pray for the work of NGOs like *Open Doors*. They currently have two ‘Centres of Hope’ in Syria. They are also aiming to build 20 new centres to provide families with the basic needs they require in order for them to stay in Syria.

Myanmar- In August 2017, violence forced more than 650,000 Rohingya people to flee Myanmar into neighbouring Bangladesh. Heavy rains and powerful winds have torn through the camps, leaving behind crumpled shelters and families scrambling to rebuild. Pray for NGOs like *Save the Children* as they respond to this crisis by repairing latrines and shelters damaged by the rains, providing food, water and safe spaces for children, and hygiene kits to stop disease spreading.

Nigeria— Due to Boko Haram’s militant-style Islam, 130,000 people have fled to Niger and more than 240,000 people are currently displaced within Cameroon, according to the U.N. migration agency. Pray for NGOs like *Barnabas Fund* as they support these displaced people.

USA— Recently, US immigration separated more than 1,600 children from their parents. The United States has the largest backlog of asylum cases in the world.

Australia— Over 30,000 people are currently seeking asylum in Australia.

Prayer- *Almighty and merciful God, whose Son became a refugee and had no place to call his own; Look with mercy on those today who are fleeing from danger, those who are homeless and hungry. Bless those who work to bring them relief; Inspire generosity and compassion in all our hearts; And guide the nations of the world towards that day. When all will rejoice in your Kingdom of justice and peace. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen*
