Give thanks for Government Grants

Over the last few months, our church has been the fortunate recipient of a few Government Grants! We give thanks that, although there is a separation of Church and State enshrined in our nation's laws, the church is still seen as a valid community organisation, deemed worthy of receiving the taxpayer's support.

On a Local government level (Georges River Council), our church has just received a *Heritage Grant* of \$4,000 towards the painting of church windows and repair work of broken windows in our church. (Last year, we received a similar sum to help us repair the roof and pressure clean the outside walls of the church.) Last year, we also received some money from the Council for community outreach by connecting with the lonely and vulnerable. For that, Naomi organised a special morning tea. Our next event may be an afternoon tea for the elderly.

On the State government level, our NSW Government Minister (Mark Coure) came to see us this past Wednesday to award us a grant of \$11,000 to be used towards enclosing our breezeway area for year-round use. As a facility often used by the community, an enclosed foyer will enhance what we offer to the local public and make it possible for us to welcome more groups into our buildings. This project includes the purchase and installation of louvered windows and glass doors.

On the Federal level of government, our Federal member of Parliament, David Coleman, has secured a grant of \$6,000 to be used for the purchase and installation of 40 solar panels on the church roof and all the necessary gear to substantially reduce our energy bills. Within that grant, there is the acknowledgement that we will be installing reverses-cycle air conditioning in the hall to make the public use of that space more amenable to all.

One more application for a grant from the Federal government called the "Volunteer Grant" was submitted recently to help us in our training of Sunday School teachers and Team Leaders. We will let you know the outcome of that application in due course.

In the meantime, please pray for our governments and the upcoming elections.
