Pray for Christians in Syria

You have likely seen on the news how tensions have recently exploded in Syria. Once the USA started to pull its troops out of the north-eastern region, Turkey was free to attack the Kurds. Unfortunately, there are many Christian communities in the area currently targeted by military actions, and reports from the ground are alarming.



The United Nations estimates that over 100,000 people have already had to leave their homes in northern Syria. Open Doors staff confirm that the Christians who are still in this region have witnessed shooting at the border in addition to some houses being destroyed. Some believers have already fled their homes, while the rest are left trying to determine whether or not to leave their communities.

George, a Syrian pastor tells us, "Each day there are more than 10 buses taking people from all religions or denominations towards other cities like Homs and even Damascus." He continued, "We as a church had a meeting on Saturday (October 12) to decide if we should stay or leave. About eight families have decided to leave—a group of about 40 people. We will support whoever decides to stay by all means possible."

Please pray earnestly for:

- Pastor George and other Christian brothers and sisters who are at risk.
- The political and military leaders of all nations involved
- All those who are injured or grieving,
- A strengthening of the Church's testimony in this hardship.
- Open Doors' international team. They have designated Syria as an emergency situation. As a result, Open Doors partners are on the ground in northern Syria, providing relief and rehabilitation to those afflicted—including emergency food, shelter, clothing, medical care, and hygiene kits to those left without access to basic provisions. Long-term, Open Doors partners will continue to help the affected communities rebuild by equipping them with educational support, vocational training, home repair, and trauma counselling.
